



ICAR-CIFA organized 3-day training on “Polyculture of Indian Major Carps and Small Indigenous Fish Species” during 02-04 August 2023 at RRC-Rahara, West Bengal

A 3-day training on “Polyculture of Indian Major Carps and Small Indigenous Fish Species” was organized for SC fish farmers under the SCSP project, “IXX17408: Economic empowerment and capacity building of rural SC farm families of West Bengal through technological intervention in fish farming during 02-04 August 2023, by ICAR-Central Institute of Freshwater Aquaculture at its Regional Research Station, Rahara, West Bengal. The training was



inaugurated by Dr.B.N.Paul, SIC, RRS, Rahara and delivered welcome address to the participants. The training consisted of lectures, demonstration, and interaction sessions on various aspects of Indian major carps and small indigenous fish species of India including, nursery and rearing pond management of carps, natural fish food organisms, water and soil quality management, composite fish culture of carps, nutrition and feeding of carps, farm-made feed, and health management of carps. The lectures were delivered by all the scientists of R.R.S., Rahara and by Dr.S.S.Giri, HOD, FNP (Virtually). The participants were highly satisfied with the topics taught, and practical classes conducted during the training programme.
